

Year 3 Homework Spring 1

This half term our topic is Roald Dahl. In order to support this learning in school, you will have a selection of projects you can choose to complete for homework. These projects will be shared with the rest of the class and house points provided in recognition of the hard work you put into your projects.

You will be expected to choose **TWO** of the following tasks to complete over the next four 5 weeks. Project one will be due in **Friday 18th January** and the second project will be due in on **Friday 8th February**. This will provide roughly 2 weeks per project/task. Should children will to complete more than two tasks, there will be additional house points provided.

Choose TWO from the following...

<p>Find out what Fairtrade is. Create a persuasive poster to encourage people to buy Fairtrade products. Think carefully about what information they would need to know.</p>	<p>Create 8 word problems based around Roald Dahl characters and chocolate. This could include shopping, recipes... You must use a variety of operations (x + -). Make sure you include an answer sheet!</p>	<p>Investigate the terms 'reversible' and 'irreversible' Once you know what they mean, create a poster to show your understanding. Your poster must include definitions and examples of each one. Is there an experiment you could do to explain these terms?</p>
<p>Write a review of the 'George's Marvellous Medicine' play we have watched at the theatre (1st Feb 2018). What was it about? What were the best bits? Why? What age range/ gender is it best for? Why? Would you recommend it?</p>	<p>Create your own Roald Dahl character. Think about their name and what their personality is like. Draw a series of drawings of your character in the style of Quentin Blake to go with a description.</p>	<p>Design a new chocolate bar. What would it be made from? Design a wrapper for your new bar – catchy name, how will you make it stand out? Shape, colour, size.</p>
<p>Saucepans ready! It's time to make your own revolting recipe! George creates a marvelous medicine for granny. Design your own marvelous medicine – make it in a bottle and attach the revolting recipe with it! (separate sheet provided)</p>	<p>Interview: Imagine you have met Roald Dahl or one of the characters from one of his books. You are going to interview them. Write down 10 questions you would like to ask them. Think carefully about the questions you'd ask and be prepared to explain why you'd ask them.</p>	<p>How could you keep a cup of tea warm? Design an investigation to find out what materials would be best to keep a cup of tea warm. Be sure to have a prediction, diagram to show how you'll test it, results and a conclusion to show what you discovered!</p>
